1968

In The Beginning

In 1967, Jonathan McSwiney, an executive with his family firm, Roscrea Meat Products, introduced the idea of a Lions Club for Roscrea to Veterinary Surgeon, Bill Burke in the factory canteen.

They decided to call a meeting to see if there were similarly-minded people in town. Their efforts were not successful but when the idea was mentioned to George Fäsenfeld over a drink in Nora O'Connor's pub, a spark was ignited.

George invited a cross-section of the community to a meeting (with refreshments) in the Pathé Hotel. The meeting was addressed by members of Thurles Lions Club led by Noel Treacy. The decision to form the Club was taken and the officers were elected. The choice of President was an inspired one. Billy Carroll, retired Cinema operator and Social Welfare Officer, was one of the most respected members of the Community. His wide experience, joviality and friendliness assured the success of the club from the start.

The Charter night in the Pathé Hotel on November 28th 1968 was a gala occasion and was an opportunity to introduce the aims of the new Club to the townspeople. The District Governor Harold Earle, came from Lancashire since Irish Lions Clubs were then part of a U.K. District.

Our meetings were held in a room in Christy Maher's Pub conveniently adjacent to the Bar. One meeting ran somewhat later than usual and resulted in virtually all the members of the Club "having their names taken" by a over-enthusiastic Garda who spotted them leaving "The Bus Stop" after midnight.

Fundraising was the young club's first requirement. A novel idea at the time - the 10 Mile Charity Walk - was to be the first serious attempt to raise funds. The enthusiasm of all the members (- especially George Fäsenfeld who raised the amazing sum of £500) resulted in the opportunity to identify the Club's first major Project. Roscrea Community Services Committee was doing excellent work in entertaining the Senior Citizens of Roscrea but didn't have a proper venue. So it was decided to purchase Todd Ryan's Shoe-Shop in Rosemary Street and donate it to the Committee.

This was the first of many projects that Roscrea Lions Club has undertaken. The Annual Barbecues in Mount Butler (courtesy of Victor Mitchell) were a great source of revenue as well as fun and entertainment. Whether or not Billy Carroll brought his revolver to protect the takings at the entrance will never be verified.

All our projects are made possible by the generosity of the townspeople in contributing to and participating in the Lions Club's fundraising activities, many of which are mentioned in this publication. The spirit of Lionism continues to flourish in Roscrea today and its 30 year old history of service to the people of Roscrea stands as a quiet monument to the inspiration of the early years.









Charity Walks




The Charity Walk was the first major Fund Raising undertaken in 1969. It continues to be an important source of fund resources.






